The PEAI actively represents the Irish Embalmers at the European level. PEAI believes in the importance of having an Irish organisation which can independently represent Irish embalmers and that members will have their own voice in Europe and internationally. The PEAI also provides continuous support in training and education and also has a very helpful and effective practical work support system for members.

It is the aim of the PEAI that professional embalming standards within Ireland be raised and maintained at a level that is worthy of international recognition. The main driving force behind it all is the genuine understanding and compassion for the deceased who cannot speak for themselves and the bereaved families whose lives are being touched in so many ways by the passing away of their loved-ones.

The PEAI is gaining more interest from both the 'traditional & experienced' embalmers and young aspiring professionals.
